- 3. Tasked to Evaluate & Compile Options for Partial Replacement of Turf surrounding Pioneer Center
- 4. Inspect all Common Area Trees for Health & Safety Issues
  - > The BOD/Phil has directed the Landscape Committee at the Nov 6 meeting to review the following:
  - (1) Inspect ALL trees within ALL common areas from Hardy Way through the entire development and determine if the trees should be removed due to (a) poor health (b) safety issue.
  - > (2) For all tagged trees we need to recommend if the trees should be (a) Replaced with another tree. (b) Replaced with a shrub or (c) Not replaced.

- 2. Continuation of 2018 Projects
